PREMISE

Save a Life Cancer Awareness and Support Network (SALCASUN) is an NGO that engages in creating awareness especially for women on cancer and also give support to vulnerable cancer patients targeting early support stage.

ISSUES

There is an existing Cancer Trust Fund set up in partnership Community Health and Research Initiative (CHR) to support women and children with cancer. SALCASUN embarks on grassroots and also urban outreach along with Doctors for testing and women are discovered with the diseases at various stages. This affects their marriage eventually.

MORE ISSUES...

Cancer treatment and surgery (in case of it) involves various levels, steps and approaches from basic to advanced hence the importance of early detection through screening in order to prevent deterioration to the advanced stage of treatment/surgery. Available resources/equipment for cancer care in Kano are inadequate compared to current population.

...MORE ISSUES.

A woman's health is her childrens health because if she knows how to look out for her health she would know how to look out for her childrens health, a win win for the husband.

Kano State Govt is trying its best in this regard by giving women access to free cancer screening through KETfund and Muhammadu Buhari Hospital every October of each year spanning four years so far.

RECOMMENDATIONS

Women should go for screening in order to detect early-stage cancer
